IICS Mobile Library survey:

The Drop Everything And Read(DEAR) program, was initiated in IICS in the year 2015, with the intent to inculcate the habit of reading among the students. This program was successfully implemented and the benefits of reading were very visible or evident among the students. So the management at IICS decided to spread the joy and benefits of reading to people of the nearby villages.

The project “ **Agents of Change**” was initiated and was put in practice in two villages of Sarjapur in the month of January-February 2018. It was observed that this newly acquired reading habit changed the perspective of the people in these villages. The people now made efficient decisions and actively participated in bringing about a meaningful change in the society they live in. These observations led to the expansion of the project to more villages in the nearby areas and creation of Mobile Library.

The IICS Mobile Library has a collection of books mainly for beginners and was started with the intent of promoting reading habit among the men and empower women, so that they contribute effectively in bringing about the necessary changes in

the society they live in. The IICS mobile library will provide the villagers easy access to the books or reading material.

For effective implementation of the project, a survey was conducted in Sarjapur by Ms. Nagasuhasini, Ms. Neelamma and Dr. Vidya, who visited the Sarjapura village with nine student volunteers on 27th October 2018. This survey was carried out in Teacher's colony, KTNR layout and Corporation bank street. The group went to each house and conducted the survey to know their academic qualification, age, languages known and the book preferences. The people were excited and co-operated with our team. The demand for Kannada reading material was more, though some preferred English too. This survey would prove helpful in the successful and effective implementation the program.





Gender sensitisation and self- protection session:

An awareness session on Gender sensitisation and self- protection was conducted in IICS on October 30th and October 31st by Dr. Vidya. The objective of this session was to impart value education to create respect among the genders. Emphasis was given to the abuse against women and children and how to protect themselves.
